Preparing Ourselves for Worship During the Musical Prelude ...



Scientists tell us that dense fog covering seven city blocks to a depth of 100 feet is composed of less than one glass of water. That amount of water is divided into about 60 billion droplets. Yet when those minute particles settle over a city or the countryside, they have the power to blot out almost everything from human sight.

It's easy, even for people of faith, to

live in a fog. How easy it is to permit a mere cupful of troubles to cloud our vision and dampen our spirit. We want to rise, take up our mat and walk, but we just can't picture what that new life is like.

Those who work in the field of addiction and recovery are very familiar with this sort of subconscious resistance. Whatever it is that addicts are trying to give up is easily named but hard to let go of. Relapse follows victory, which follows relapse. Along with the apostle Paul, such struggling people could well affirm, "I do not understand my own actions. For I do not what I want, but I do the very thing I hate."

The simple truth is, they're not yet helpless enough to be healed. They're not yet ready to give up their own human efforts to solve their problems. They're not ready to admit they have NOT the power within them to make it on their own. And that's where faith can step in if we invite it.




On the day I called, you answered me, you increased my strength of soul. All the kings of the earth shall praise

Second Lesson Romans 7: 13-25 The Inner Conflict in Humans Carol



Did what is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, working death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure.

For we know that the law is spiritual; but I am of the flesh, sold into slavery under sin. I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I

agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.
