"There is no cash register at the Panera café near Government Center in Boston. There are no prices either - just suggested donations and bins to leave money, if you can afford to." So says the Boston Globe, in an article about the Panera Cares Café that opened its doors in January, 2013. What a business model! It's a social-outreach project of the Panera Bread Company, most of whose restaurants operate in traditional menu-with-prices mode. At a few select urban locations, the company's Panera Cares Foundation has been experimenting with this new way of operating.

The surprising thing is, it seems to work - at least in carefully-researched locations, in which new patrons are briefed on the restaurant's pay-it-forward philosophy. The concept is that those who can't pay for their meals, volunteer a little time to help operate the place, and that those who can afford it, leave a little extra money on the counter. The Panera Cares Cafés are feeding considerably more than 5,000 - and what's more, they're helping more than 5,000 feed themselves.





Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for

themselves.' Jesus said to them, 'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said,
